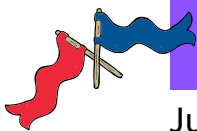
### DECEMBER

### SEPTEMBER



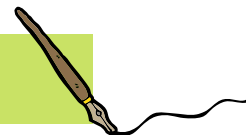
